13. Entries

Deadline for entries is **15th of August, 2018**. The entry forms should be sent to the following e-mail: Cracow.Show@gmail.com no later than on 15th of August, 2018.

The checking list is required for verifying entries made by one owner.

Notices:

Please, add copies of the horse passport pages with the pedigree and description.

Horses entered after the deadline or entered with incomplete data on the entry form, will not be put in the catalogue, so will not be able to compete in the Show.

Horses can be **withdrawn up to the 20th of August 2018** with no financial restrictions. Owners of horses withdrawn after the 20th of August 2018 and horses which will not appear on the showground will be charged a full entry fee.

14. Entry fees

- **EUR 50** (incl.VAT) – fee for entering one horse to Halter Classes I-X (A and B)
- **EUR 50** (incl. VAT) – fee for entering one horse to Riding Classes D, E and F
- **EUR 75** (incl. VAT) – fee for stabling one horse on 6th-9th of September 2018 in a tent stable, incl. one straw bedding.
- **PLN 50** (incl. VAT) – fee for plugging in a horse truck into electricity

Notice:

Arrival before September 6th and stabling after September 9th is possible under prior agreement for EUR 15 per box per day.

The "Szary" Equestrian Club provides straw for the first bedding, a larger amount of straw can be purchased on the spot. **The organizer does not provide hay and oats – these need to be brought by the exhibitor himself.**

Owners of horses competing in halter classes I-X, A, as well as riding classes D, E and F will receive **two single VIP invitations** to the VIP sector for 7th-9th of September, 2018, for the Breeders Night Party on September 8th, 2018 and for the morning program on Sunday, 9th of September.

Exhibitors from classes B and C can purchase single VIP invitations or order the table in the prices:

- **EUR 100** (incl. VAT) – single VIP card
- **EUR 350** (incl. VAT) – VIP table – maximum 4 person

In the VIP sector soft and hot drinks, as well as snacks will be served. Meals will not be served. All meals (full board) can be purchased at the cafeteria in the indoor arena and at the restaurant in the "Szary Residence" hotel on the grounds of the Szary Equestrian Club.

Access

By car: exit Cracow in the direction of Kielce and Warsaw along route E7. In Michałowice a downhill drive along a hairpin turn and then, after passing a crossing with a road to Więclawice, after a marked pedestrian crossing, after 20 m take the road left and upwards (sign: *Stowarzyszenie Klub Jazdy Konnej Szary*).

17. Accommodation

Cracow, a former capital of Poland, offers plenty of accommodation in hotels in the historic city center and near the airport. You can also use the portal www.booking.com to find accommodation closer to the venue in Michałowice, Bronowice, Ojców.

We recommend Best Western Efekt Express Kraków Hotel, 20 minutes drive from the showground, which offers single rooms for EUR 61/per night and double rooms for EUR 70/per night. **If you require our assistance with your accommodation booking, please contact our office: Cracow.Show@gmail.com**

18. Prizes

The ribbons will be given to the horses from 1st to 5th place in each class as well as to the Gold, Silver and Bronze Medalist. Each class winner will receive a trophy sponsored by the class sponsor.

The organizer allows the possibility of other additional prizes sponsored by sponsors, provided then they are submitted on one month before the show and provide the rules for awarding the prize.

19. Rules for Conduct of Shows

The show is open only to pure Arabian horses registered in WAHO approved stud books as well as foals born in 2018, sired by and out of pure bred Arabian parents registered in WAHO approved stud books.

- The horses will be shown in hand, walk and trot in following classes:
 - I yearling colts (A and B)
 - II two years old colts
 - III three years old colts
 - IV yearling fillies (A and B)
 - V two years old fillies
 - VI three years old fillies
 - VII 4-6 years old mares
 - VIII 7 years old mares and over
 - IX stallions 4-6 years old
 - X stallions 7 years old and over
 - Class A geldings
 - Class B foals above one month
 - Class C amateur handlers
- The organizer reserves the right to join classes in the case of insufficient number of horses, in the classes from I to X. The minimum number of entries necessary to create a class is 3.
- The organizer reserves the right to split the class.
- Each class from I to X as well as class A (geldings) will be judge by three independent judges. The judges will not confer during the class.
- The horses will be shown in hand, walking and trotting.
- The horse will be judged on type, conformation and movement.
- The following point system will be used, in the classes from I to X and class A (with half points):
 - Type – max 20 points
 - Head and neck – max 20 points
 - Body – max 20 points
 - Legs – max 20 points
 - Movements – max 20 points
 Total max 100 points.
- The number of points awarded by each judge will be displayed simultaneously. The final score for each horse will be the average score awarded by the judges, means max. 100 points. This determinates the results. In the event of a tie, the higher place will be given to the horse with most points for type. If there is still a tie, the higher place will be given to the horse with the most points in movement. Failing a decision on either of these, one judge chosen by ballot will name his preference.

20. Championships

- Colts that placed first and second in classes I, A and B qualify for the Yearling Colts Championships.
- Colts that placed first and second in classes II and III qualify for the Junior Stallions Championships.

- Stallions that placed first and second in classes IX and X qualify for the Senior Stallions Championships.
- Colts and Stallions in a given championship will be led onto the arena in order of their start numbers and be presented individually in trot. After one lap around the show arena all colts will be led onto the arena and placed in order of their start numbers.
- The Gold Champion, Silver Champion and Bronze Champion will be selected by the judges among all stallions qualified for the championships.
- The judges will announce the Gold, Silver and Bronze Champion at the same time.
- The colts and Stallions nominated by the judges will receive points (based on the open method of choosing medalists given in the Blue Book 2018). The appropriate medals (places in the championship) will be determined by the sum of points awarded by the judges.
- Fillies that placed first and second in classes IV, A and B qualify for the Yearling Fillies Championships.
- Fillies that placed first and second in classes V and VI qualify for the Junior Mares Championships.
- Mares that placed first and second in classes VII and VIII qualify for the Senior Mares Championships.
- Fillies and Mares in a given championship will be led onto the arena in order of their start numbers and be presented individually in trot. After one lap around the show arena all fillies will be led onto the arena and placed in order of their start numbers.
- The Gold Champion, Silver Champion and Bronze Champion will be selected by the judges among all mares qualified for the championships.
- The judges will announce the Gold, Silver and Bronze Champion at the same time.
- Fillies and Mares nominated by the judges will receive points (based on the open method of choosing medalists given in the Blue Book 2017). The appropriate medals (places in the championship) will be determined by the sum of points awarded by the judges.

21 . Rules for holding the foal class:

- The presentation of foals can take place individually or with their dams (mares). The foals can be presented with halters, show halters or freely, provided that safety is ensured to both people and animals.
- Foals must be shown at foot (with the dam) up to 6 months of age.
- The use of metal halters and halters with metal chains is forbidden.
- The horses will be evaluated regarding type, beauty, correctness of build and movement.
- The judges (Judging Committee) will evaluate the foals together, agreeing upon the verdict and lining up the foals in order of assigned places (ranking method).

22. Rules for holding the amateur class:

- Mares and stallions that won a bronze, silver or gold medal at „Title”, A and B shows cannot participate in the amateur-presenters class until the end of the calendar year in which this win took place, as well as over two next, subsequent calendar years, unless

a horse passes into another age category (from “yearlings” to “juniors” or from “juniors” to “seniors”).

- Geldings that won a silver or gold medal at „Title” and A shows cannot participate in this class until the end of the year in which this win took place, as well as over the next calendar year.
- Horses can be presented by persons who were not remunerated for showing, training and preparing horses for shows. Remuneration is understood as any form of payment, received while being a permanent employee or as a result of occasional showings, as well as all and any in kind benefits.
- The amateur-presenters class is open to horses of any age and sex.
- The horse will be judged individually by three independent judges, who can not communicate with each other during judging.
- The horse will be shown walking and trotting.
- The horse will be judged on type, conformation, movement, level of being prepared for the show, cooperation with the trainer.
- The following point system will be used:
 - Type – max 20 points
 - Conformation – max 20 points
 - Movement – max 20 points
 - Level of being prepared for the show – max 20 points
 - Cooperation with the trainer – max 20 points

Total: max 100 points

- The number of points awarded by the each judge will be displayed simultaneously. The final score for each horse will be the average score awarded by the judges, means max. 100 points. This determinates the results.
- In the event on a tie, the higher place will be given to the horse with most points for type. If there is still a tie, the higher place will be given to the horse with the most points in cooperation with the trainer. Failing a decision on either of these, one judge chosen by ballot will name his preference.

23. Rules for holding riding classes

(D) Classic Pleasure – N Level

Riders perform in a classic equestrian outfits, using the equipment specified for dressage classes by FEI. The horse should give the impression of being a pleasure to ride and show a mannerly attitude. All gaits must be performed straight and willingly with ease, cadence and balance. Transitions should be smooth.

Competitors enter the ring together, in counter clockwise direction. The evaluation starts with the ringmaster signal. The riders itself will not be judged but, of course, influences the performance of the horse. The following items are subject to evaluation:

- Walk
- Normal trot
- Canter
- Back at the middle line

The ringmaster gives a signal to change the direction.

Penalties are granted for:

- Wrong gaits are shown
- Kicking
- Bucking
- Disturbing other competitors

Disqualifications according to FEI:

- Fall of the horse
- Lameness
- Blood
- Wrong/not allowed equipment

(E) Native Costume – N Level:

Riders perform in oriental outfits (including footwear). The horse bridle and saddle is tailored to rider's convention. In this class in addition to the horse-rider pair working together, also judged is the rider's costume, composition of the whole appearance and attention to detail.

The following items are subject to evaluation:

- Walk
- Canter
- Back at the middle line

The ringmaster gives a signal to change the direction.

Penalties are granted for:

- Wrong gaits are shown
- Kicking
- Bucking
- Disturbing other competitors

Disqualifications according to FEI:

- Fall of the horse
- Lameness
- Blood
- Wrong/not allowed equipment

(F) Show Jumping – N level:

The show jumping class will be judged according to the rules of the National Equestrian Federation in which the event takes place. Level N – E-A – obstacles 70-80 cm.

Penalties:

- 1st refuse – 3 penalties
- 2nd refuse – 6 penalties
- 3rd refuse – elimination
- obstacle knocked down – 4 penalties
- first fall of horse or competitor or both elimination

The 3rd Cracow Arabian Horse Show is held in accordance with "Rules of Conduct of Show" of the European Arabian Horse Commission (EAHSC) of ECAHO. The show is affiliated by ECAHO as C – International (affiliation number: 110-2018/PL).

Veterinary conditions

1. All horses participating in the show, excluding foals, must have a passport with an entry confirming that the vaccinations against equine influenza are up-to-date (the validity of the vaccinations expires after 6 months).
2. Foals must be submitted to the stud book and be microchipped. Foals weaned from their dams should have documented primary vaccinations.
3. Means of transport should be disinfected and comply with current regulations.
4. Appropriate certificates and passports should be submitted in the show office prior to the show.

Please note

Horse transports without the required veterinary certificates will not be allowed to enter the show grounds and therefore the horses will not be allowed to unload and placed in the stables. Please read the additional information regarding vaccinations.

Additional information about vaccinations

The obligatory vaccination scheme against equine influenza can be found in the veterinary rules of the Polish Equestrian Federation:

a) primary vaccination:

- first dose – on the day of starting the vaccination
- second dose – not earlier than on the 21st day and not later than by the 92nd day from the date of the first vaccination

b) booster vaccination:

- every 6 months from the date of the last vaccination (a 21-day period of going over the deadline is allowed)
- none of the booster vaccinations can take place later than 7 days prior to arriving at the show grounds
- a horse that participates in a show for the first time has to have at least the primary vaccination confirmed in its passport

Detailed rules regarding vaccinations described in item 3.3.2 (Veterinary rules of the Polish Equestrian Federation) are universal for all events with the participation of horses.
